

## Senior Patrol Leader Responsibilities

Boy Scout Troop 223 is a “boy run” troop. The position of Senior Patrol Leader (SPL) is central to the functioning of the troop. It is a big job, but it can also be very rewarding and a great learning experience. The ideas, actions, and leadership of the SPL truly determine the character of the troop. All SPL candidates with their parents must understand what they are committing to before they are placed on the ballot. In addition, the Scoutmaster must certify that each candidate has demonstrated leadership abilities, scout spirit and helpfulness to others.

The Troop 223 SPL is expected to:

- Preside over all troop meetings, events, and activities. If the SPL is unable to attend an activity, he is responsible for arranging for his ASPL or another boy leader to assume the SPL responsibilities.
- Appoint his ASPL and other troop senior boy leaders with the advice and consent of the scoutmaster.
- Arrange for the location of the monthly Patrol Leaders Council meetings and chair those meetings.
- Work with the other boy leaders as well as the Scoutmaster and adult leaders to plan and execute all troop activities, arriving atleast 10 minutes in advance.
- Set a good example.
- Follow the Scout Law and Oath.
- Wear the uniform correctly.
